Dina Peone: 23 yrs. old, Saugerties. "I'm transferring to New Paltz in the fall and spending time working on my poetry and art."




Gulnar Babayeva: 24 yrs. old, Cottekill. "I'll be at the Woodstock School of Art on a scholarship!"
