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The program focuses on the education of regular and exceptional bilingual/multicultural populations. In addition, it offers intensive Spanish language classes (from beginning to advanced levels) for professionals focusing on the development of academic language for use in school settings. Regular university courses will be taught in English. Participants will have the opportunity to observe Mexican public schools in action. The first week of the program is onsite in Mexico City where students visit the National Palace and the paintings of Diego Rivera. For the remainder of the program, students are in Guanajuato working in public schools, living with host families and taking university coursework from international faculty and scholars. Students will earn 3-6 units from the University of Arizona. Courses may be applicable towards various degree programs, endorsements and/or certifications in regular, bilingual/ESL, and special education.
