With the safety and well-being of everyone on campus a top priority, college officials are urging students, faculty and staff to register now for the SUNY Ulster Alert system. An email from Vice President Ann Marrott recently went out to everyone through a portal announcement stating that signing up takes less than a minute. The emergency information system is employed in the event of critical, life threatening campus emergencies. The system sends automated voice messages, emails, text and fax messages to those who enroll in the service.
