Timothy Marra: 20 yrs. old, Pine Bush. "It's closer to home than Orange County Community College."



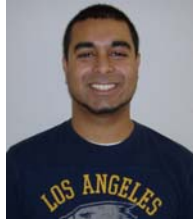
Candance Minervini: 28 yrs. old, Kingston. "I wanted to come here first for my general studies."
