MODERN TAKE ON SASHIKO EMBROIDERY

Sashiko is a form of decorative reinforcement stitching from Japan traditionally used to reinforce points of wear or to repair worn places or tears with patches. Mostly geometric patterns are used to make this work. The embroidery uses special sashiko thread and needle. Modern day sashiko stitching uses a variety of color combinations, and it is considered a beautiful surface embellishment for fabrics.
